As many of you may be aware of, there have been several updates issued by U.S. Customs and Border Protection ("CBP") over the past couple of months regarding changes to the in-bond procedures for the movement of bonded merchandise. Per the Federal Register, bonded merchandise may be entered at a U.S. port of entry, without appraisal or the payment of duties, for transportation to another port for entry, or for exportation, provided that all statutory and regulatory conditions are met. As described in detail below, CBP updated 19 CFR §18 in-bond process and CBP Port of Columbus issued a Pipeline notice regarding local ePTT changes.



19 CFR §18 In-Bond Changes

CBP recently issued Federal Register Volume 82, No. 187 dated September 28, 2017 updating 19 CFR §18 to enhance CBP's ability to regulate, track the movement of bonded merchandise, and to simplify and facilitate the in-bond process. In addition, please refer to Pipeline Number 18-002 (Changes to Customs and Border Protection In-Bond Procedures) issued by CBP Port of Columbus on October 26, 2017. Effective November 27, 2017, CBP is eliminating the paper in-bond application (CBP Form 7512) and will require carriers or their agents to file in-bond applications electronically. Effective January 2, 2018, CBP will no longer accept paper copies of CBP Form 7512 to perform arrival and export functionality. There are additional implementation timeline changes taking effect in early 2018 regarding the in-bond process. The supply chain community should carefully review the in-bond changes provided for in 19 CFR §18 and consider testing, if necessary, to ensure compliance with future in-bond filings and declarations.

Port of Columbus – ePTT Changes

To comply with the CBP mandate for the trade community to utilize the Automated Commercial Environment ("ACE") as the primary system through which the trade community reports import and export activity, CBP Port of Columbus has determined it was necessary to eliminate the use of "blanket" Permit-to-Transfers ("PTT") allowing merchandise to move within the geographic limits of the Port of Columbus. to Pipeline Number 17-002 (Elimination of Blanket Permits to Transfer within the Port Limits) issued by CBP Port of Columbus on August 17, 2017. Effective January 1, 2018, all electronic PTT's are required to be filed via the Electronic Data Interchange or ACE Portal for the movement of bonded merchandise within the Port of Columbus. The supply chain community may consider following up with its supply chain service provider or consider conducting tests to confirm processes are in place to comply with this Pipeline initiative prior to the effective date on January 1, 2018.

In conclusion, the supply chain community should consider evaluating changes made to 19 CFR §18 and to the Pipeline notice issued by CBP Port of Columbus regarding the elimination of the "blanket" PTT process to determine any impact to business processes.

Joseph Nardone Chosen as Airport Authority President & CEO



COLUMBUS – Today the Board of Directors of the Columbus Regional Airport Authority unanimously passed a resolution naming Joseph R. Nardone, C.M., as the next President & CEO.

Slated to start mid-January, Nardone currently serves as the Chief Executive Officer of the Wayne County Airport Authority, which operates Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW). As the country's 19th busiest airport, DTW served nearly 34.5 million passengers in 2016. With service from 13 airlines, the airport offers more than 1,100 flights per day to more than 140 nonstop destinations on four continents. The Wayne County Airport

Authority also operates Willow Run Airport (YIP), which serves cargo, corporate and general aviation clients.

"I'm excited by the opportunity to leverage the strength of the community to advance air service development efforts and create even stronger partnerships benefitting the Columbus Region," said Nardone. "It will be an honor to lead the Columbus Regional Airport Authority, which is highly regarded in the industry for its best-in-class management and airport operations."

Prior to serving as CEO of DTW, Nardone served as the airport's Vice President of Business Development and Real Estate. He also served as the Director of Southgate Properties, a nonprofit with multi-million dollar real estate transactions, and as the economic development director of the City of Taylor, Michigan. His career also includes over a decade spent in the private sector with Huron Valley Steel Corporation, where he served as Vice President managing real estate and development activities in the U.S. and Europe.

"Joe's achievements in the aviation industry, combined with his work in the nonprofit and private sectors, position him to further our vision to connect Ohio with the world," said Board Chair Susan Tomasky. "His extensive real estate and economic development experience, including playing a critical role in bringing Spirit Airline's \$32 million state-of-the-art maintenance hangar to the Detroit airport, can be leveraged to accelerate business and service expansion at our airports."

Nardone will lead the independent airport authority of the nation's 14th largest city, overseeing the strategic operation and management of passenger-focused John Glenn Columbus International Airport (CMH), cargo-focused Rickenbacker International Airport (LCK), and general aviation airport Bolton Field (TZR). The three airports and select

businesses with direct ties to the airports account for more than 54,000 jobs, \$1.8 billion in annual payroll and \$6.6 billion in total annual economic output.

"Input from a variety of community and industry stakeholders served as a springboard for our robust, national search for the next President & CEO," said board member Terrance Williams, who led the special search committee. "Joe provides the right combination of proven success in air service growth, economic development and building the mutually-beneficial, public-private partnerships that our community needs as we move forward."

Nardone has committed to a four-year employment agreement to succeed retiring President & CEO Elaine Roberts, A.A.E, an industry veteran who led the airport authority for 17 years.

"Elaine's thoughtful, strategic leadership leaves behind a strong foundation from which we will build upon for the continued long-term success of our airports," said Tomasky.
