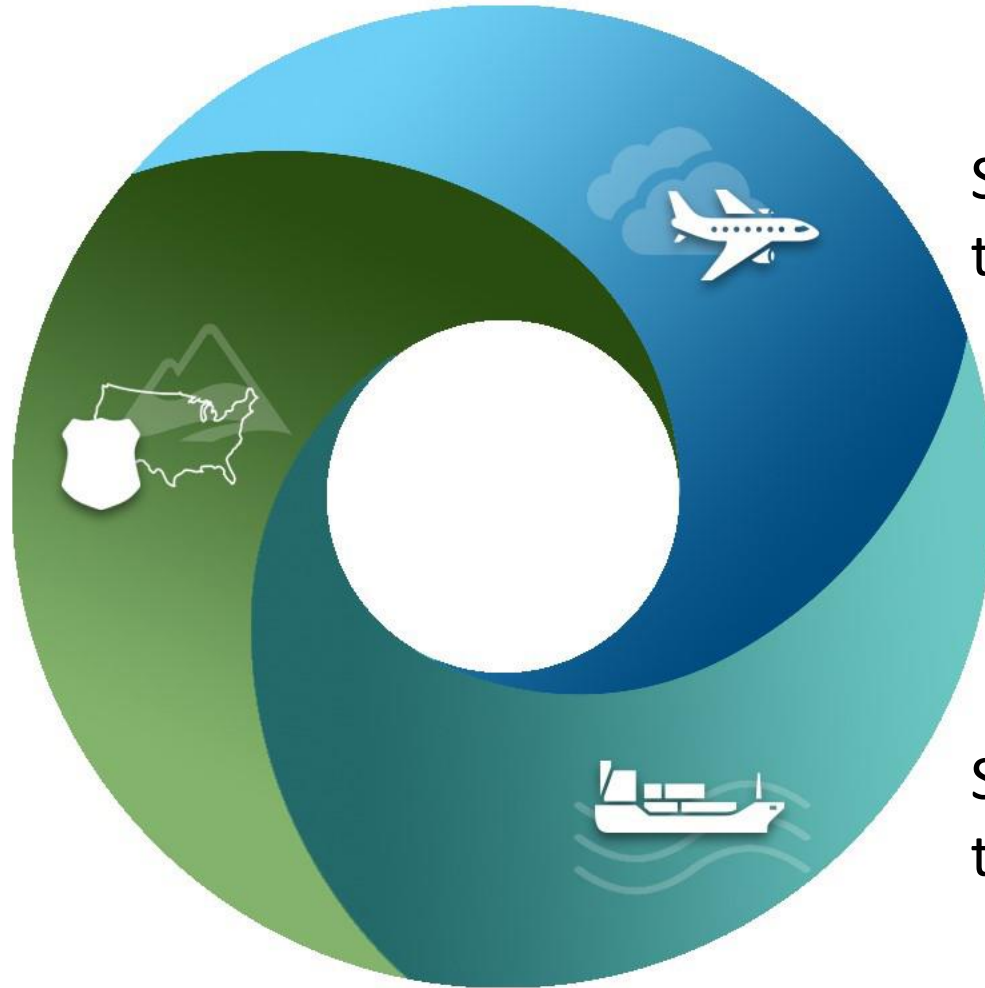

ON A TYPICAL DAY, CBP:

Processed:

- 650,178 passengers and pedestrians
 - 169,842 incoming international air passengers and crew
 - 35,795 passengers and crew on arriving ship/boat
 - 444,541 incoming land travelers
- 187,049 incoming privately owned vehicles
- 77,895 truck, rail, and sea containers
- \$6.64 billion worth of imported goods
- 90,000 entries of merchandise at our air, land, and sea ports of entry
- \$216 billion in duties, taxes and other fees, including more than \$204 million in duties



ON A TYPICAL DAY, CBP: *Continued*

Based on fiscal year 2020 data

DISCOVERED:

- 250 pests at U.S. ports of entry and 3,091 materials for quarantine: plant, meat, animal byproduct, and soil

SEIZED:

- 3,677 pounds of drugs
- \$386,195 illicit currency seized
- \$3.6 million worth of products with Intellectual Property Rights violations

- 2 International Airports (CMH & LCK)
- 1 International General Aviation Facility (GAF)
- 2 Rail Yards
- 1 Centralized Examination Station (CES)
- 18 Container Freight Stations (CFS)
- 25 Foreign Trade Zone Sites (FTZ)

BY THE NUMBERS

- \$11.9 billion – imports
- \$743.4 million – exports

COVID 19 – continued impact

Commercial Passenger and General Aviation Flights

- Restrictions on travel from Europe, Canada and Mexico have been lifted.
- International passenger flights have resumed but passenger numbers are down.

Cargo Flights

- Increased international cargo flights expected short-to-near term due backlog of general cargo
- Long term impact remains unclear
